Statewide:

- The Illinois unemployment rate has declined from its peak of 10.2% (August 2011) to 8.7% (February 2014)
- In March 2014, the total number of claimants for regular unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois declined by 0.2% compared to last year and new certifications for regular unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois declined by 0.2% compared to last year and new certifications for regular unemployment insurance benefits dropped by 15%.
- In March 2014, the average duration of claimants for regular benefits in Illinois was 12.80 weeks, compared to last year's level of 11.36 weeks

The total number of claimants certified for collecting regular UI benefits is 197,843.


These claimants viewed 126,067 job orders and activated 24,357 job applications.


