Statewide:

- The Illinois unemployment rate has declined from 7.7% (March 2014) to 6.0% (March 2015)
 In March 2015, the total number of claimants for regular unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois declined by 21.4% compared to last year and new certifications for regular unemployment insurance benefits dropped by 8.3%.

 In March 2015, the average duration of claimants for regular benefits in Illinois is 11.46 weeks, compared to last year's level of 12.83 weeks

Statewide

The total number of claimants certified for collecting regular UI benefits is 159,713.

These claimants viewed 131,290 job orders and activated 25,554 job applications.
