Statewide:

- The Illinois unemployment rate has declined from 6.7% (March 2021) to 4.7% (March 2022).
- In March 2022, the total number of claimants for regular unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois decreased by 50.9% compared to last year, and new certifications for regular unemployment insurance benefits decreased by 52.3%.
- In March 2022, the average duration of claimants for regular benefits in Illinois is 12.32 weeks, compared to last year's level of 11.57 weeks.

The total number of claimants certified for collecting regular UI benefits is 112,037.

These claimants viewed 111,134 job orders and activated 15,472 job applications.
