Statewide:

- The Illinois unemployment rate has decreased from 4.4% (June 2022) to 4.0% (June 2023).
- In June 2023, the total number of claimants for regular unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois increased by 25.7% compared to last year, and new certifications for regular unemployment insurance benefits increased by 6.1%.
- In June 2023, the average duration of claimants for regular benefits in Illinois is 11.23 weeks, compared to last year's level of 10.58 weeks.
