Statewide:

- The Illinois unemployment rate has declined from 5.5% (September 2021) to 4.5% (September 2022).
- In September 2022, the total number of claimants for regular unemployment insurance benefits in Illinois decreased by 70.6% compared to last year, and new certifications for regular unemployment insurance benefits decreased by 35.1%.
- In September 2022, the average duration of claimants for regular benefits in Illinois is 11.10 weeks, compared to last year's level of 12.50 weeks.
