## National Data (Only data from the Monthly Report, Table A-5 will be updated monthly)

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reports monthly the employment status of the civilian population 18 years and over by veteran status, period of service and sex, not seasonally adjusted. (Table A-5) In March 2016, the unemployment rate for all Veterans over 18 was 4.5%, down from 4.9% in March 2015. The unemployment rate for Gulf War-era II Veterans over 18 was 6.3% in March 2016, down from 6.5% from March 2015. These numbers are not seasonally adjusted; they come from a small sample and are highly volatile from one month to the next. Please note, veterans' annual average unemployment provided in the Veterans' Employment Situation are more accurate than the monthly estimates discussed here and thus are better suited for inclusion in public presentations, grant applications, etc.

## **State Data**

Employment and unemployment statistics by Veteran status for the state of Illinois presented here are annual averages produced by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Veteran's Employment and Training Services (VETS) in the Department of Labor. These figures are used by VETS in their State allocations under the Jobs for Veterans Act. The Illinois unemployment rate for Veterans aged 18 years and older in 2015 was 5.0 percent, down from 7.0 percent in 2014. The BLS cautions that these data come from a small sample and are subject to large sampling error.

The unemployment rate for Post 9/11 Veterans in Illinois was 5.8 percent in 2015 compared to the 5.0 percent rate for Total Veterans in Illinois. The margins of error may be large due to small sampling size.
