	the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act provides, in part,
	that for purposes of determining "wages", any employing
	unit which is owned or controlled by the same interests
	which own or control another employing unit shall be
	treated as a single unit with the unit so owned or
	controlled by such interests for any calendar year
	throughout which such ownership or control exists. As a
	result, for example, in 2005 (for which the maximum per
	employee wage amount subject to contributions is
	\$10,500), only the first \$10,500 of the total combined
	wages the employers paid to the individual will be subject
	to contributions. Absent the above-cited language, the first
	\$10,500 in wages each employer separately paid to the
	individual would be subject to contributions.
