# Introduction

*Where Workers Work* features basic private sector employment totals (i.e., employment covered by the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act) for six northeastern Illinois counties (Cook, Du Page, Kane, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will), major communities in each of these counties, and zip codes within the City of Chicago. This is not the Chicago Metropolitan Division (MD). As of June 2003, the definition of the Chicago MD includes eight counties: Cook, De Kalb, Du Page, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties. Lake County is included in the Lake County-Kenosha County, IL-WI MD. Data for the other three Illinois counties (DeKalb, Kendall, and Grundy) that are included in the Chicago MD but not part of this report are available on the LMI Source Web site (<http://lmi.ides.state.il.us>), by selecting the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (ES-202) link, then Illinois At Work.

*Where Workers Work* utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report employment and payroll information. This information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment by individual work locations. However, data in *Where Workers Work* do, wherever possible, reflect actual worksites of work locations.

Effective with the 1988-89 edition, O'Hare International Airport was reported as part of the City of Chicago rather than Northwest Suburban Cook; appropriate adjustments have been made so that the historical data shown in this edition also reflect that change. Effective with the 1972 edition, more than 20 new suburban communities were broken out from "miscellaneous" and "unclassified" groupings and are so noted. Effective with 2002 data, another 19 breakouts were added and are so noted. Finally, the zip code 60648 is no longer shown because the zip has been deleted by the US Postal Service.

The **industry breakouts** in these tables are identified by name and by NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) code. The data tables for *Where Workers Work* began using NAICS in 2001. The data tables used the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) industry coding prior to 2001. Data for employment is not comparable at the industry level for SIC and NAICS.

# Highlights

The preliminary 2011 total for UI-covered employment in the metro area increased to 3,192,426 - which is up 1.9% or 59,375 jobs.

Employment levels increased in Cook County and 4 of the 5 collar counties

The number of establishments increased overall for the Chicago Metro Area

The number of establishments doing business in the Chicago metro area increased 3,465 (+1.5%) from 2010 to 2011p (p=preliminary data) for a total of 240,195. Cook County had an increase of 2,381 (+1.7%), which included an increase of 1,250 (+1.9%) for the City of Chicago. Du Page County increased by 231 (+0.6%) establishments, Lake County by 312 (+1.5%), Mc Henry County by 63 (+0.7%), Will County by 282 (+2.0%), and Kane County by 196 (+1.5%).

# County Analysis

## Cook County

Cook County had an increase in employment of 33,465 (+1.7%) from March, 2010 to March, 2011. The City of Chicago had an increase in employment of 23,045 (+2.3%). Industry sectors with the biggest employment increases in the county during that time period were Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (12,642; +8.0%), Health Care & Social Assistance (9,414; +3.1%), Accommodations & Food Services (6,965; +3.8%), Transportation & Warehousing (3,231; +3.1%), Retail Trade (3,052; +1.4%), and Educational Services (2,935; +3.5%). Industries with significant employment losses were Finance & Insurance (-3,841; -2.6%), Construction (-2,111; -3.6%), Management of Companies & Enterprises (-809; -1.8%), and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (-613; -2.0%).

## Du Page County

Du Page County had an increase in employment of 15,218 (+3.1%) from March, 2010 to March, 2011. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (3,302; +7.4%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (2,088; +4.5%), Management of Companies & Enterprises (1,730; +8.9%), Health Care & Social Assistance (1,691; +3.1%), Manufacturing (1,492; +3.0%), Wholesale Trade (1,057; +2.4%), and Educational Services (913; +6.2%). The industry with the biggest decline in employment was Information (-1,062; -9.3%).

## Kane County

Kane County had an increase in employment of 834 (+0.5%) from March, 2010 to March, 2011. Manufacturing (1,755; 6.3%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (773; +9.3%), and Wholesale Trade (385; +3.4%) had the biggest increases in industry employment. The industries having the biggest declines in employment were Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (-886; -6.2%), Finance & Insurance (-385; -5.1%), Information (-364, -10.2%) and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (-264; -5.3%).

## Lake County

Lake County had an increase in employment of 4,072 (1.6%) from March, 2010 to March, 2011. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (2,715; +15.8%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (1,737; +10.0%), and Transportation & Warehousing (246; +5.6%). The industries with declines in employment included Finance & Insurance (-556; -3.7%) and Construction (-477; -5.2%).

## Mc Henry County

Mc Henry County had a decrease in employment of 50 (-0.1%) from March, 2010 to March, 2011. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Manufacturing (501; +3.4%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (208; +4.1%), and Accommodations & Food Services (130; +1.8%). The industries having the biggest declines in employment were Wholesale Trade (-280; -5.5%), Construction (-274; -5.5%), and Information (-156, -15.6%).

## Will County

Will County had an increase in employment of 5,836 (+3.8%) from March, 2010 to March, 2011. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Manufacturing (1,359; +7.5%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (1,225; +14.8%), Transportation & Warehousing (1,143; +13.3%), and Health Care & Social Assistance (1,141; +5.4%). The industries with declines in employment included Finance & Insurance (-291; -4.9%), Information (-256, -8.3%), Construction (-252; -2.6%), and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (-116; -3.3%).

## technical notes

Data in *Where Workers Work* are: 1) preliminary for the most current year, 2) as of March for each year, 3) subject to revision in subsequent years, and 4) based on information collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance (UI) Act: The Illinois UI Act covers any employer of one or more workers in each of 20 or more calendar weeks or with a payroll of at least \$1,500 in any calendar quarter in the current or preceding calendar year. Data are for the private sector and exclude government workers.

## geographic definitions


CHICAGO METRO AREA: Cook, Du Page, Kane, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties. This is not the Chicago Metropolitan Division (MD). As of June 2003, the definition of the Chicago MD includes eight counties: Cook, De Kalb, Du Page, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties. Lake County is included in the Lake County-Kenosha County, IL-WI MD. These two MDs combine with a third, Gary, IN MD, to form the Chicago-Naperville-Joliet, IL-IN-WI Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA).

MISCELLANEOUS UNCLASSIFIED: A grouping of suburban communities or geographic areas that cannot be shown separately because none has been assigned a unique code. An explanation of Miscellaneous Suburban Areas is provided on pages 8-11 of this file.

## special comments

*Where Workers Work* utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report their employment, and this information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment **by work location**.

**It should also be noted that specific community data may be impacted to a significant extent by employer reporting inconsistencies.**

# Where Workers Work Announcement

The *Where Workers Work* publication features employment totals that are broken out by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) categories. NAICS provides industry categories which better reflect the United States and Illinois economies.

Industries are organized on the basis of their production activities (supply) alone, as opposed to the mixture of supply and demand characteristics used to classify industries under the SIC. NAICS also standardizes the classification system of the 3 partners in the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA): the United States, Canada, and Mexico.
