Where Workers Work 2016

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Introduction

Where Workers Work features basic private sector employment totals (i.e., employment covered by the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act) for six northeastern Illinois counties (Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry and Will), major communities in each of these counties, and zip codes within the City of Chicago. These are six of the counties in the Illinois portion of the Chicago-Naperville-Elgin, IL-IN-WI MSA, as announced by the U.S. OMB in February 2013.

Data for the other three Illinois counties (DeKalb, Kendall and Grundy) that are included in the Illinois portion of the Chicago-Naperville-Elgin, IL-IN-WI MSA, but not part of this report, are available at http://www.ides.illinois.gov/LMI/Pages/Quarterly_Census_of_Employment_and_Wages.aspx.

Where Workers Work utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report their employment, and this information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment by individual work locations. However, data in *Where Workers Work* do, wherever possible, reflect actual worksites of work locations. It should be noted that specific community data may be impacted to a significant extent by employer reporting inconsistencies.

QCEW data are not designed as a time series. QCEW data are simply the sums of individual establishment records and reflect

the number of establishments that exist in a county or industry at a point in time. Establishments can move in or out of a county or industry for a number of reasons—some reflecting economic events, others reflecting administrative changes. For example, economic change would come from a firm relocating into the county; administrative change would come from a company correcting its county designation.

Effective with the 1998-89 edition, **O'Hare International Airport** was reported as part of the City of Chicago rather than Northwest Suburban Cook; appropriate adjustments have been made so that the historical data shown in this edition also reflect that change.

Effective with the 1972 edition, more than 20 **new suburban communities** were broken out from "miscellaneous" and "unclassified" groupings and are so noted. Effective with 2002 data, **another 19 breakouts** were added and are so noted. Finally, the zip code 60648 is no longer shown because the zip code has been deleted by the U.S. Postal Service.

The **industry breakouts** in these tables are identified by name and by NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) code. The data tables for *Where Workers Work* began using NAICS in 2001. The data tables used Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) industry coding prior to 2001. Data for employment is not comparable at the industry level for SIC and NAICS.

Highlights

The revised 2015 total for UI-covered (private sector) employment in the metro area increased to 3,444,928 - which is up 1.9% or 63,753 jobs.

The number of establishments decreased overall for the Chicago Metro Area

The number of establishments doing business in the Chicago metro area decreased 6,108 (-2.4%) from 2014 to 2015r (r=revised data) for a total of 249,530. Cook County had a decrease of 3,487 (-2.2%), which included a decrease of 1,810 (-2.5%) for the City of Chicago. Du Page County decreased by 942 (-2.4%) establishments, Lake County by 783 (-3.4%), Mc Henry County by 300 (-3.4%), Will County by 247 (-1.6%), and Kane County by 349 (-2.5%).

NOTE: The decrease in establishments was due largely to the deactivation of establishment records that were previously considered active but had no employment or wages for at least eight quarters. Our new policy is to deactivate such accounts on a quarterly basis.

County Analysis

Cook County

Cook County had an increase in private sector employment of 55,668 (+2.6%) from March, 2014 to March, 2015. The City of Chicago had an increase in employment of 29,100 (+2.6%). Industry sectors with the biggest employment increases in the county during that time period were Construction (5,537; +9.4%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (8,450; +4.1%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (8,861; +4.8%), Health Care & Social Assistance (9,095; +2.7%), Retail Trade (6,329; +2.8%), and Transportation and Warehousing (4,988; +4.5%). The industry with a significant employment loss was Educational Services (-971; -1.1%).

Du Page County

Du Page County had an increase in private sector employment of 1,231 (+0.2%) from March, 2014 to March, 2015. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Construction (2,075; +9.6%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (2,110; +3.9%), Manufacturing (1,990; +3.7%), and Health Care & Social Assistance (2,653; +4.2%). The industries with the biggest declines in employment were Management of Companies & Enterprises (-3,723; -14.2%), Retail Trade (-2,328; -3.7%), and Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (-2,609; -4.8%).

Kane County

Kane County had an increase in private sector employment of 2,096 (+1.2%) from March, 2014 to March, 2015. Construction (563; +7.3%), Manufacturing (729; +2.4%), Retail Trade (587; +3.0%), and Accommodations & Food Services (408; +2.8%) had the biggest increases in industry employment. Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (-1,031; -4.8%), and Information (-188; -6.1%) had the biggest declines in employment.

Lake County

Lake County remained level in private sector employment with a decline of 112 (0.0%) from March, 2014 to March, 2015. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Construction (1,148; +12.7%), Real Estate & Rental & Leasing (282; +8.4%), Transportation & Warehousing (225; +4.6%), and Retail Trade (560; +1.4%). The industries with declines in employment included Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (-600; -11.5%), Information (-466; -13.1%), Educational Services (-457; -7.9%), and Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (-483; -2.4%).

Mc Henry County

Mc Henry County had a decrease in private sector employment of 256 (-0.3%) from March, 2014 to March, 2015. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Construction (453; +8.6%) and Health Care & Social Assistance (328; +3.3%). The industries having the biggest declines in employment were Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (-707; -9.3%), Wholesale Trade (-254; -5.3%), and Manufacturing (-188; -1.2%).

Will County

Will County had an increase in private sector employment of 4,902 (+2.7%) from March, 2014 to March, 2015. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Retail Trade (1,170; +4.4%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (940; +10.7%), Accommodations & Food Services (1,186; +6.6%), Wholesale Trade (939; +6.4%), Health Care & Social Assistance (591; +2.4%), and Construction (213; +2.0%). The industries with declines in employment included Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (-888; -6.7%), and Finance & Insurance (-508; -10.4%).

technical notes

Data in Where Workers Work are: 1) preliminary for the most current year, 2) as of March for each year, 3) subject to revision in subsequent years, and 4) based on information collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance (UI) Act: The Illinois UI Act covers any employer of one or more workers in each of 20 or more calendar weeks or with a payroll of at least \$1,500 in any calendar quarter in the current or preceding calendar year. Data are for the private sector and exclude government workers.



The *Where Workers Work* publication features employment totals that are broken out by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) categories. NAICS provides industry categories which better reflect the United States and Illinois economies.

Industries are organized on the basis of their production activities (supply) alone, as opposed to the mixture of supply and demand characteristics used to classify industries under the SIC. NAICS also standardizes the classification system of the 3 partners in the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA): the United States, Canada, and Mexico.
