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Introduction

Where Workers Work features private sector covered employment totals (i.e., employment covered by the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act) for six northeastern Illinois counties (Cook, Du Page, Kane, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will), major communities in each of these counties, and zip codes within the city of Chicago. These 6 counties comprise the bulk of the Illinois portion of the official Chicago-Naperville-Joliet, IL-IN-WI MSA and have been included in Where Workers Work since it was first published. County-level data for the other three Illinois counties (De Kalb, Grundy and Kendall) in the Illinois portion of the MSA that are not included in this report are available at the LMI Source Web site (lmi.ides.state.il.us), by selecting the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (ES-202) link, then Illinois at Work.

Where Workers Work utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report employment and payroll information. This information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment by individual work locations. However, since 1991, data in *Where Workers Work* do, wherever possible, reflect actual worksites of work locations as reported under the Business Establishment List (BEL) initiative discussed in the Special Comments section on page 4 of this file.

In addition to the BEL initiative, there have been a few other developments affecting Where Workers Work. Effective with the 1988-89 edition, **O'Hare International Airport** was reported as part of the City of Chicago rather than Northwest Suburban Cook; appropriate adjustments have been made so that the historical data shown in this edition also reflect that change. Effective with the 1972 edition, more than 20 **new suburban communities** were broken out from "miscellaneous" and "unclassified" groupings and are so noted. Effective with 2002 data, **another 19 breakouts** were added and are so noted. Finally, the zip code 60648 is no longer shown because the zip has been deleted by the US Postal Service.

The **industry breakouts** in these tables are identified by name and by NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) code.

Highlights

The preliminary 2006 total for UI-covered employment in the metro area increased to 3,403,502 — which is up 2.1% or 70,122 jobs from 2005.

Employment levels grew in the City of Chicago, Cook County, and all 5 collar counties

The number of firms increased throughout the Chicago Metro Area

The number of establishments doing business in the Chicago metro area increased 10,651 (+5.1%) from 2005 to 2006p (p=preliminary data) for a total of 219,788. Cook County had an increase of 6,092 (+4.8%) while there was also an increase of 3,200 (+5.6%) for the City of Chicago. Du Page County increased by 1,387 establishments (+4.2%), Lake County by 840 (+4.4%), Mc Henry County by 466 (+6.2%), Will County by 1,182 (+10.8%), and Kane County by 684 (+6.0%).

County Analysis

Cook County

Cook County had an increase in employment of 33,741 (+1.6%) from March, 2005 to March, 2006. The City of Chicago had an increase in employment of 24,132 (+2.3%). Industry sectors with the biggest employment increases in the county during that time period were Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (+6.5%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (+4.1%), Accommodations & Food Services (+3.8%), Construction (+4.9%), Retail Trade (+1.6%), Health Care & Social Assistance (+1.0%), Educational Services (+3.4%), and Finance & Insurance (+1.3%). Industries with significant employment losses were Manufacturing (-3.9%), Transportation & Warehousing (-2.1%), and Information (-2.8%).

Du Page County

Du Page County had an increase in employment of 13,860 (+2.7%) from March, 2005 to March, 2006. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (+10.6%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (+4.5%), Health Care & Social Assistance (+4.3%), Wholesale Trade (+2.8%), Transportation & Warehousing (+4.8%), and Construction (+3.1%). The industries with declines in employment included Retail Trade (-2.2%) and Manufacturing (-0.8%).

Kane County

Kane County had an increase in employment of 3,383 (+2.0%) from March, 2005 to March, 2006. Construction (+9.7%), Health Care & Social Assistance (+4.9%), Educational Services (+16.9%), Wholesale Trade (+4.5%), and Accommodations & Food Services (+3.4%) were the industries with the largest employment gains. Retail Trade (-1.3%) and Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (-1.0%) were industries that had employment losses.

Lake County

Lake County had an increase in employment of 3,985 (+1.4%) from March, 2005 to March, 2006. The industries with the biggest increases in employment were Retail Trade (+2.9%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (+5.0%), and Finance & Insurance (+6.5%). Construction (+2.8%) and Health Care & Social Assistance (+1.5%) also fared well. Manufacturing (-1.8%) showed the biggest declines in employment.

Mc Henry County

Mc Henry County had an increase in employment of 3,363 (+4.2%) from March, 2005 to March, 2006. Construction (+7.8%), Manufacturing (+3.0%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (+8.1%), Wholesale Trade (+8.8%), Health Care & Social Assistance (+4.1%), and Accommodations & Food Services (+4.4%) were the industries with the biggest increases in employment. Electrical Equipment, Appliance, & Component Manufacturing (-5.9%) had a loss of employment.

Will County

Will County had an increase in employment of 11,790 (+8.8%) from March, 2005 to March, 2006. Accommodations & Food Services (+16.7%), Retail Trade (+7.8%), Health Care & Social Assistance (+9.8%), Construction (+7.6%), Transportation & Warehousing (+14.1%), Manufacturing (+4.2%), and Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (+13.7%) were among the industries with increases in employment.

technical notes

Data in *Where Workers Work* are: 1) preliminary for the most current year, 2) as of March for each year, 3) subject to revision in subsequent years, and 4) based on information collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance (UI) Act: The Illinois UI Act covers any employer of one or more workers in each of 20 or more calendar weeks or with a payroll of at least \$1,500 in any calendar quarter in the current or preceding calendar year. Data are for the private sector and exclude government workers.

geographic definitions

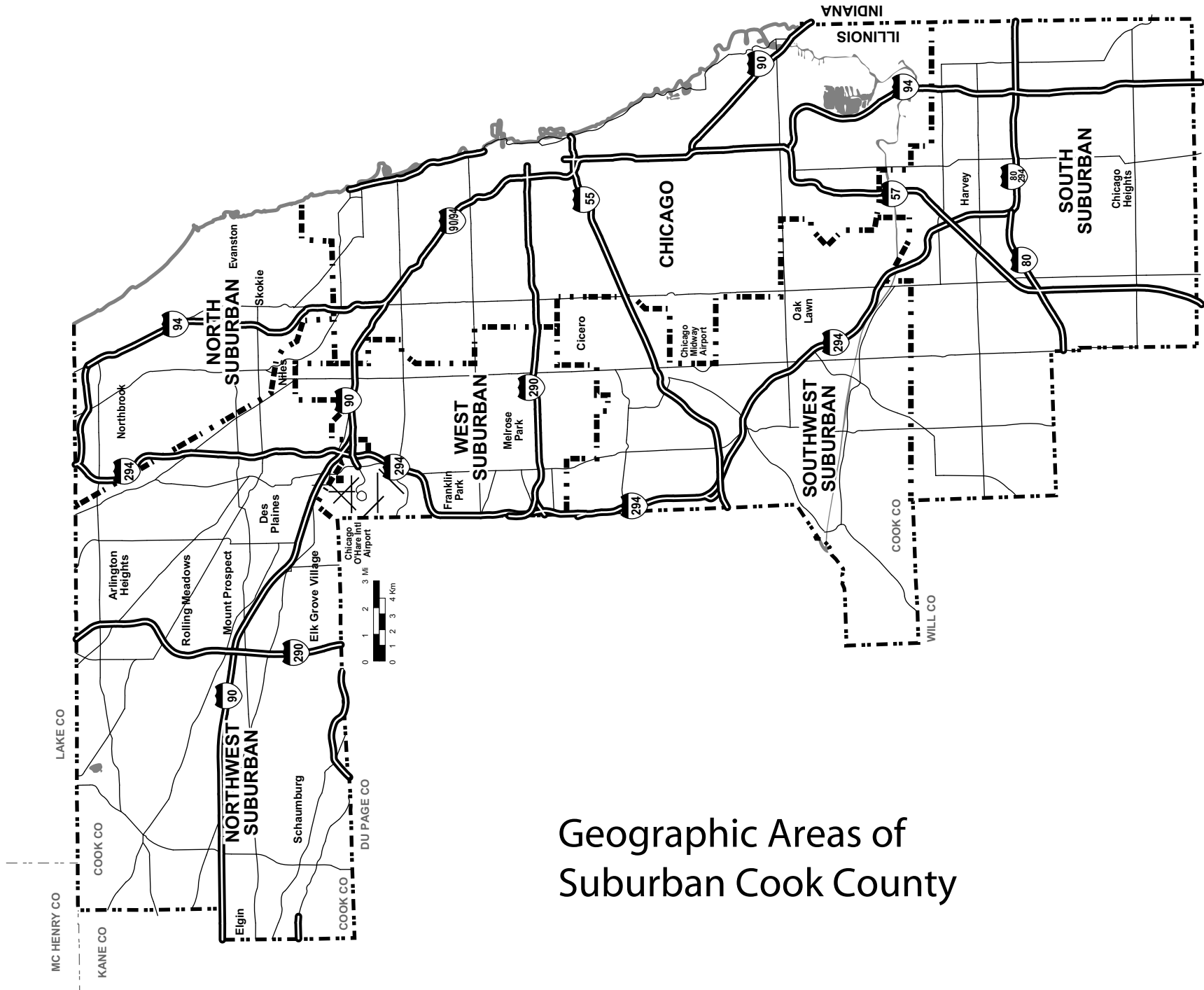
CHICAGO METRO AREA: Cook, Du Page, Kane, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties. This is not the Chicago Primary Metropolitan Statistical Area (PMSA). As of January 1994, the definition of the Chicago PMSA includes nine counties: Cook, De Kalb, Du Page, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties.

MISCELLANEOUS / UNCLASSIFIED: A grouping of suburban communities or geographic areas that cannot be shown separately because none has been assigned a unique code. An explanation of Miscellaneous / Unclassified Suburban Areas is provided on pages 8-11 of this file.

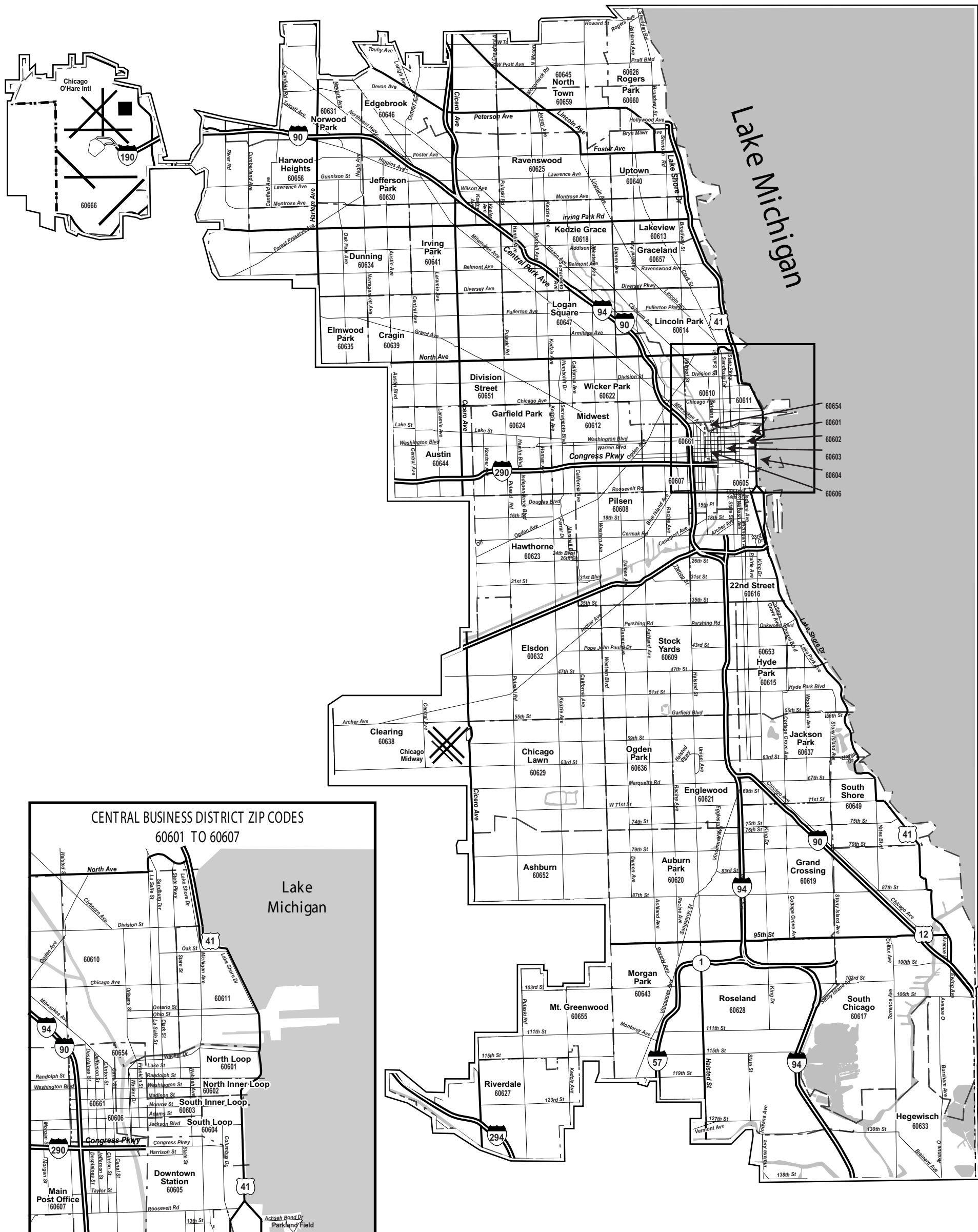
Where Workers Work utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report their employment, and this information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment **by work location**. The US Bureau of Labor Statistics recently initiated a nationwide intensive effort to solicit employment information **by work location**, called the Business Establishment List (BEL). The first effects of BEL are reflected in 1991. Under BEL, employment for multiple work locations, that was traditionally reported wholly at a headquarters or central location, is now reported for each work location. This more accurately reflects the distribution of employment in Illinois, but caused an interruption in the data series as of 1991. We will continue to report data for years prior to 1991 as a courtesy (establishment tables appear again this year), but comparisons across time are discouraged.

It should also be noted that specific community data may be impacted to a significant extent by employer reporting inconsistencies.

Where Workers Work Announces

The *Where Workers Work* publication features employment totals that are broken out by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) categories. NAICS provides industry categories which better reflect the United States and Illinois economies.

Industries are organized on the basis of their production activities (supply) alone, as opposed to the mixture of supply and demand characteristics used to classify industries under the SIC. NAICS also standardizes the classification system of the 3 partners in the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA): the United States, Canada, and Mexico.
