Introduction

Where Workers Work features basic private sector employment totals (i.e., employment covered by the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act) for six northeastern Illinois counties (Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry and Will), major communities in each of these counties, and zip codes within the City of Chicago. This is not the Chicago Metropolitan Division (MD). As of June 2003, the definition of the Chicago MD includes eight counties: Cook, DeKalb, DuPage, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, McHenry and Will counties. Lake County is included in the Lake County-Kenosha County, IL-WI MD.

Data for the other three Illinois counties (DeKalb, Kendall and Grundy) that are included in the Chicago MD, but not part of this report, are available at http://www.ides.illinois.gov/LMI/Pages/Quarterly_Census_of_Employment_and_Wages.aspx.

Where Workers Work utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report their employment, and this information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment by individual work locations. However, data in *Where Workers Work* do, wherever possible, reflect actual worksites of work locations. It should be noted that specific community data may be impacted to a significant extent by employer reporting inconsistencies.

QCEW data are not designed as a time series. QCEW data are simply the sums of individual establishment records and reflect the number of establishments that exist in a county or industry at a point in time. Establishments can move in or out of a county or industry for a number of reasons—some reflecting economic events, others reflecting administrative changes. For example, economic change would come from a firm relocating into the county; administrative change would come from a company correcting its county designation.

Effective with the 1998-89 edition, **O'Hare International Airport** was reported as part of the City of Chicago rather than Northwest Suburban Cook; appropriate adjustments have been made so that the historical data shown in this edition also reflect that change.

Effective with the 1972 edition, more than 20 **new suburban communities** were broken out from "miscellaneous" and "unclassified" groupings and are so noted. Effective with 2002 data, **another 19 breakouts** were added and are so noted. Finally, the zip code 60648 is no longer shown because the zip code has been deleted by the U.S. Postal Service.

The **industry breakouts** in these tables are identified by name and by NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) code. The data tables for *Where Workers Work* began using NAICS in 2011. The data tables used Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) industry coding prior to 2001. Data for employment is not comparable at the industry level for SIC and NAICS.

Highlights

The preliminary 2014 total for UI-covered (private sector) employment in the metro area increased to 3,381,175 - which is up 2.0% or 66,913 jobs.

The number of establishments increased overall for the Chicago Metro Area

The number of establishments doing business in the Chicago metro area increased 6,680 (+2.7%) from 2013 to 2014p (p=preliminary data) for a total of 255,638. Cook County had an increase of 4,309 (+2.8%), which included an increase of 2,447 (+3.4%) for the City of Chicago. Du Page County increased by 843 (+2.2%) establishments, Lake County by 513 (+2.3%), Mc Henry County by 175 (+2.0%), Will County by 515 (+3.3%), and Kane County by 325 (+2.4%).

County Analysis

Cook County

Cook County had an increase in private sector employment of 36,324 (+1.7%) from March, 2013 to March, 2014. The City of Chicago had an increase in employment of 18,561 (+1.7%). Industry sectors with the biggest employment increases in the county during that time period were Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (9,675; +5.5%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (8,770; +4.4%), Construction (2,554; +4.5%), Accommodations & Food Services (4,446; +2.1%), Retail Trade (4,252; +1.9%), and Health Care & Social Assistance (4,887; +1.5%). The industry with a significant employment loss was Manufacturing (-2,233; -1.2%).

Du Page County

Du Page County had an increase in private sector employment of 12,504 (+2.4%) from March, 2013 to March, 2014. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (3,025; +5.9%), Health Care & Social Assistance (3,010; +5.0%), Construction (2,172; +11.2%), Wholesale Trade (2,357; +4.8%), and Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (1,205; +2.3%). The industries with the biggest declines in employment were Transportation & Warehousing (-510; -2.2%), Finance & Insurance (-467; -1.5%), and Information (-220; -2.3%).

Kane County

Kane County had an increase in private sector employment of 3,234 (+1.9%) from March, 2013 to March, 2014. Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (1,551; +7.8%), Construction (662; +9.3%), Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (348; +7.1%), Transportation & Warehousing (266; +9.0%), and Retail Trade (261; +1.3%) had the biggest increases in industry employment. The industries having the biggest declines in employment were Manufacturing (-319; -1.0%), and Finance & Insurance (-96; -1.3%).

Lake County

Lake County had an increase in private sector employment of 5,020 (+1.8%) from March, 2013 to March, 2014. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Manufacturing (1,424; +2.9%), Transportation & Warehousing (424; +9.5%), Accommodations & Food Services (973; +4.3%), Construction (445; +5.2%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (615; +3.1%), and Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (595; +2.2%). The industries with declines in employment included Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (-188; -3.5%), Finance & Insurance (-302; -2.0%), and Health Care & Social Assistance (-218; -0.7%).

Mc Henry County

Mc Henry County had an increase in private sector employment of 2,489 (+3.3%) from March, 2013 to March, 2014. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (2,014; +36.2%), Construction (339; +6.9%), Transportation & Warehousing (161; +13.0%), and Management of Companies & Enterprises (84; +12.7%). The industries having the biggest declines in employment were Information (-146; -16.4%), Wholesale Trade (-172; -3.4%), and Finance & Insurance (-105; -4.7%).

Will County

Will County had an increase in private sector employment of 7,342 (+4.3%) from March, 2013 to March, 2014. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Wholesale Trade (1,793; +13.9%), Transportation & Warehousing (1,611; +14.1%), Construction (829; +8.4%), Administrative & Support, Waste Management & Remediation Services (850; +6.8%), Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (730; +9.0%), and Accommodations & Food Services (776; +4.5%). The industries with declines in employment included Manufacturing (-716; -3.6%), Management of Companies & Enterprises (-126; -6.6%), and Finance & Insurance (-101; -2.0%).

technical notes

Data in Where Workers Work are: 1) preliminary for the most current year, 2) as of March for each year, 3) subject to revision in subsequent years, and 4) based on information collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance (UI) Act: The Illinois UI Act covers any employer of one or more workers in each of 20 or more calendar weeks or with a payroll of at least \$1,500 in any calendar quarter in the current or preceding calendar year. Data are for the private sector and exclude government workers.

geographic definitions

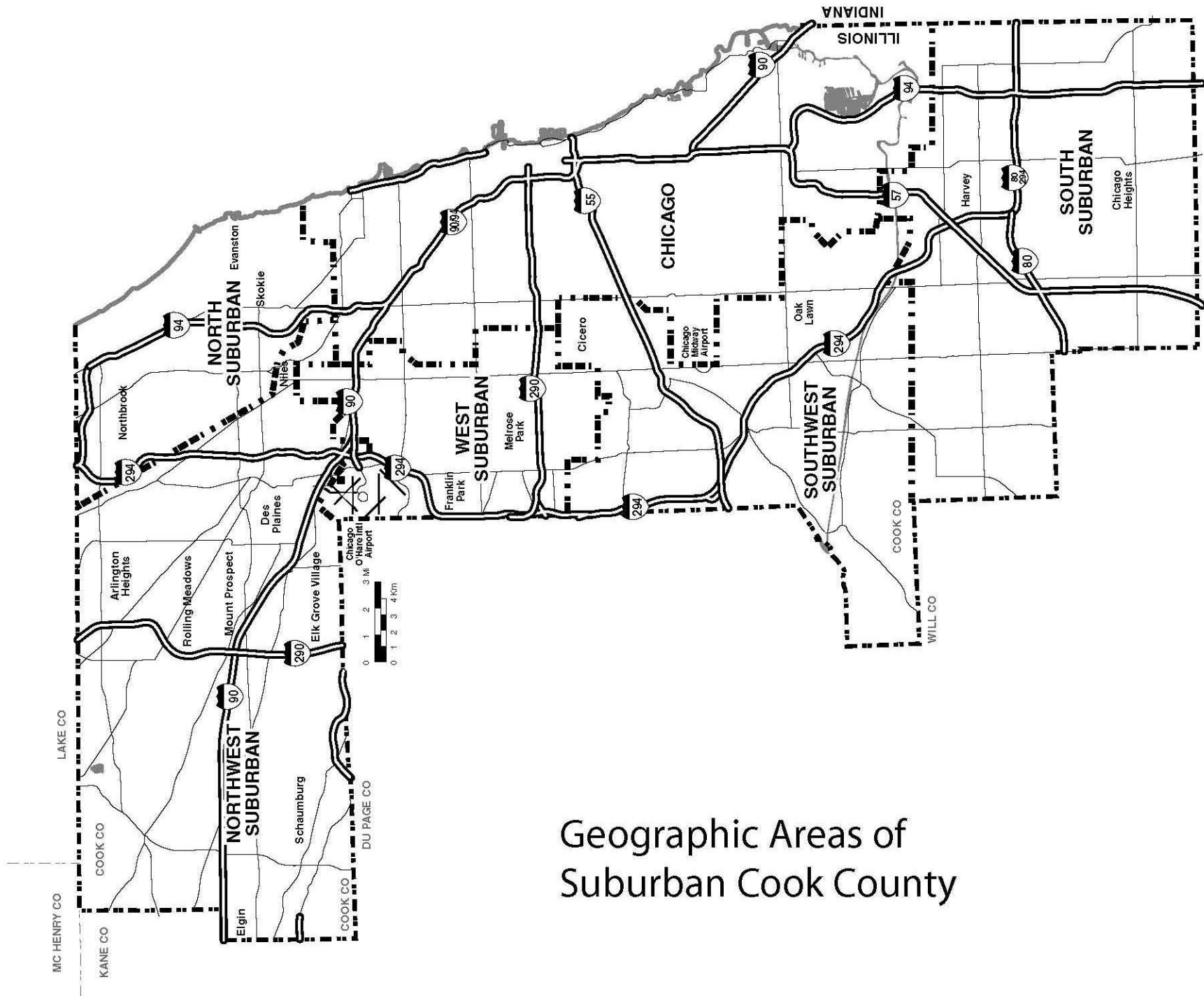
CHICAGO METRO AREA: Cook, Du Page, Kane, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties. This is not the Chicago Metropolitan Division (MD). As of June 2003, the definition of the Chicago MD includes eight counties: Cook, De Kalb, Du Page, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, Mc Henry, and Will counties. Lake County is included in the Lake County-Kenosha County, IL-WI MD. These two MDs combine with a third, Gary, IN MD, to form the Chicago-Naperville-Joliet, IL-IN-WI Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA).

MISCELLANEOUS UNCLASSIFIED: A grouping of suburban communities or geographic areas that cannot be shown separately because none has been assigned a unique code. An explanation of Miscellaneous Suburban Areas is provided on pages 8-11 of this file.

The *Where Workers Work* publication features employment totals that are broken out by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) categories. NAICS provides industry categories which better reflect the United States and Illinois economies.

Industries are organized on the basis of their production activities (supply) alone, as opposed to the mixture of supply and demand characteristics used to classify industries under the SIC. NAICS also standardizes the classification system of the 3 partners in the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA): the United States, Canada, and Mexico.
