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Introduction

Where Workers Work features basic private sector employment totals (i.e., employment covered by the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act) for six northeastern Illinois counties (Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry and Will), major communities in each of these counties, and zip codes within the City of Chicago. These are six of the counties in the Illinois portion of the Chicago-Naperville-Elgin, IL-IN-WI MSA, as announced by the U.S. OMB in February 2013.

Data for the other three Illinois counties (DeKalb, Kendall and Grundy) that are included in the Illinois portion of the Chicago-Naperville-Elgin, IL-IN-WI MSA, but not part of this report, are available at http://www2.ides.illinois.gov/LMI/Pages/Quarterly_Census_of_Employment_and_Wages.aspx.

Where Workers Work utilizes administrative data collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance Act. The Act requires employers to report their employment, and this information becomes part of the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages database (ES-202) on which *Where Workers Work* is based. The Act does not require employers to report their employment by individual work locations. However, data in *Where Workers Work* do, wherever possible, reflect actual worksites of work locations. It should be noted that specific community data may be impacted to a significant extent by employer reporting inconsistencies.

QCEW data are not designed as a time series. QCEW data are simply the sums of individual establishment records and reflect

the number of establishments that exist in a county or industry at a point in time. Establishments can move in or out of a county or industry for a number of reasons—some reflecting economic events, others reflecting administrative changes. For example, economic change would come from a firm relocating into the county; administrative change would come from a company correcting its county designation.

Effective with the 1988-89 edition, **O'Hare International Airport** was reported as part of the City of Chicago rather than Northwest Suburban Cook; appropriate adjustments have been made so that the historical data shown in this edition also reflect that change.

Effective with the 1972 edition, more than 20 **new suburban communities** were broken out from "miscellaneous" and "unclassified" groupings and are so noted. Effective with 2002 data, **another 19 breakouts** were added and are so noted. Finally, the zip code 60648 is no longer shown because the zip code has been deleted by the U.S. Postal Service.

The **industry breakouts** in these tables are identified by name and by NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) code. The data tables for *Where Workers Work* began using NAICS in 2001. The data tables used Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) industry coding prior to 2001. Data for employment is not comparable at the industry level for SIC and NAICS.

Highlights

The preliminary 2020 total for UI-covered (private sector) employment in the metro area declined to 3,574,346, a decrease of -23,886 jobs and a -0.7 percent change.

Private-Sector employment levels decreased in Cook County and four of the five collar counties.

The number of private-sector establishments in the Chicago metro area increased by +1,856 (+0.8%) from 2019 to 2020p (p=preliminary data) for a total of 227,120. Cook County had an increase of +1,198 (+0.9%) establishments, which included an increase of +755 (+1.2%) for the City of Chicago. Private-sector establishments in Will County increased by +276 (+1.9%), in Kane County by +78 (+0.6%), in McHenry County by +53 (+0.7%), in DuPage County by +172 (+0.5%) and in Lake County by +79 (+0.4%).

NOTE: In 2016, IDES instituted a policy to deactivate employer accounts with zero employment and zero wages for eight or more quarters. In 2017, a new tax system became operational which allowed for the deactivation of accounts that should have been deactivated earlier. Accounts are now deactivated on a regular basis.

County Analysis

Cook County

Cook County's private sector employment had a decrease of -13,515 (-0.6%) from March 2019 to March 2020. Industry sectors with the biggest employment increases during the period were Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (+5,380; +2.3%); Health Care & Social Assistance (+3,471; +1.0%); Finance & Insurance (+1,949; +1.2%); and Transportation & Warehousing (+955; +0.7%). Industries with largest employment losses included Accommodations & Food Services (-6,437; -2.7%); Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (-4,378; -2.2%); Retail Trade (-3,585; -1.6%); and Educational Services (-2,524, -2.7%).

City of Chicago

The City of Chicago had an increase in private sector employment of +1,791 (+0.1%) from March 2019 to March 2020. The industry sectors with the largest employment increases were in Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (+6,063; +3.7%); Health Care & Social Assistance (+2,959; +1.6%); Finance & Insurance (+1,955, +1.7%); and Manufacturing (+1,143, +1.8%). The largest decreases in employment occurred in Accommodations & Food Services (-4,634; -3.6%); Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (-2,330; -2.3%); Transportation & Warehousing (-1,391; -2.0%); and Retail Trade (-1,075; -1.2%).

Du Page County

DuPage County had a decrease in private sector employment of -5,715 (-1.0%) from March 2019 to March 2020. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Health Care & Social Assistance (+1,651; +2.3%); Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (+1,032; +14.7%); and Transportation & Warehousing (+526; +2.0%). The industry sectors with the largest employment decreases were Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (-3,773; -6.8%); Accommodations & Food Services (-2,325; -5.3%); Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (-1,352; -2.3%); and Manufacturing (-975, -1.7%).

Kane County

Kane County had a decrease in private sector employment of -4,486 (-2.5%) from March 2019 to March 2020. The industry sectors with the largest employment increases were Transportation & Warehousing (+455; +10.5%); Retail Trade (+255; +1.3%); Mining, Quarrying, & Oil and Gas Extraction (+78, +65.5%); and Real Estate & Rental & Leasing (+77, +4.4%). The largest decreases in employment occurred in Accommodations & Food Services (-1,422; -7.9%); Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (-1,297; -7.2%); and Wholesale Trade (-996; -6.7%).

Lake County

Lake County had a decrease in private sector employment of -3,795 (-1.3%) from March 2019 to March 2020. The largest increases in industry employment occurred in Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (+598; +3.0%); Transportation & Warehousing (+577; +8.8%); and Management of Companies & Enterprises (+494; +4.9%). The industry sectors with the biggest declines in employment were Accommodations & Food Services (-1,518; -5.7%); Retail Trade (-1,445; -3.6%); and Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (-854; -3.3%).

Mc Henry County

McHenry County had a decrease in private sector employment of -1,014 (-1.3%) from March 2019 to March 2020. The industry sectors with the largest increases were Construction (+189; +3.0%); Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (+109; +1.7%); and Transportation & Warehousing (+69; +4.6%). The industries having the biggest declines in employment were Manufacturing (-277; -2.0%); Retail Trade (-267; -2.1%); and Management of Companies & Enterprises (-249; -24.8%).

Will County

Will County had an increase in private sector employment of +4,639 (+2.2%) from March 2019 to March 2020. The biggest increases in industry employment occurred in Transportation & Warehousing (+2,655; +10.8%); Administrative & Support & Waste Management & Remediation Services (+837; +5.7%); and Health Care & Social Assistance (+794; +3.1%). The industries with the largest decreases in employment were Accommodations & Food Services (-479; -2.2%); Professional, Scientific & Technical Services (-328; -3.1%); and Retail Trade (-200; -0.7%).

technical notes

Data in Where Workers Work are: 1) preliminary for the most current year, 2) as of March for each year, 3) subject to revision in subsequent years, and 4) based on information collected under the Illinois Unemployment Insurance (UI) Act: The Illinois UI Act covers any employer of one or more workers in each of 20 or more calendar weeks or with a payroll of at least \$1,500 in any calendar quarter in the current or preceding calendar year. Data are for the private sector and exclude government workers.

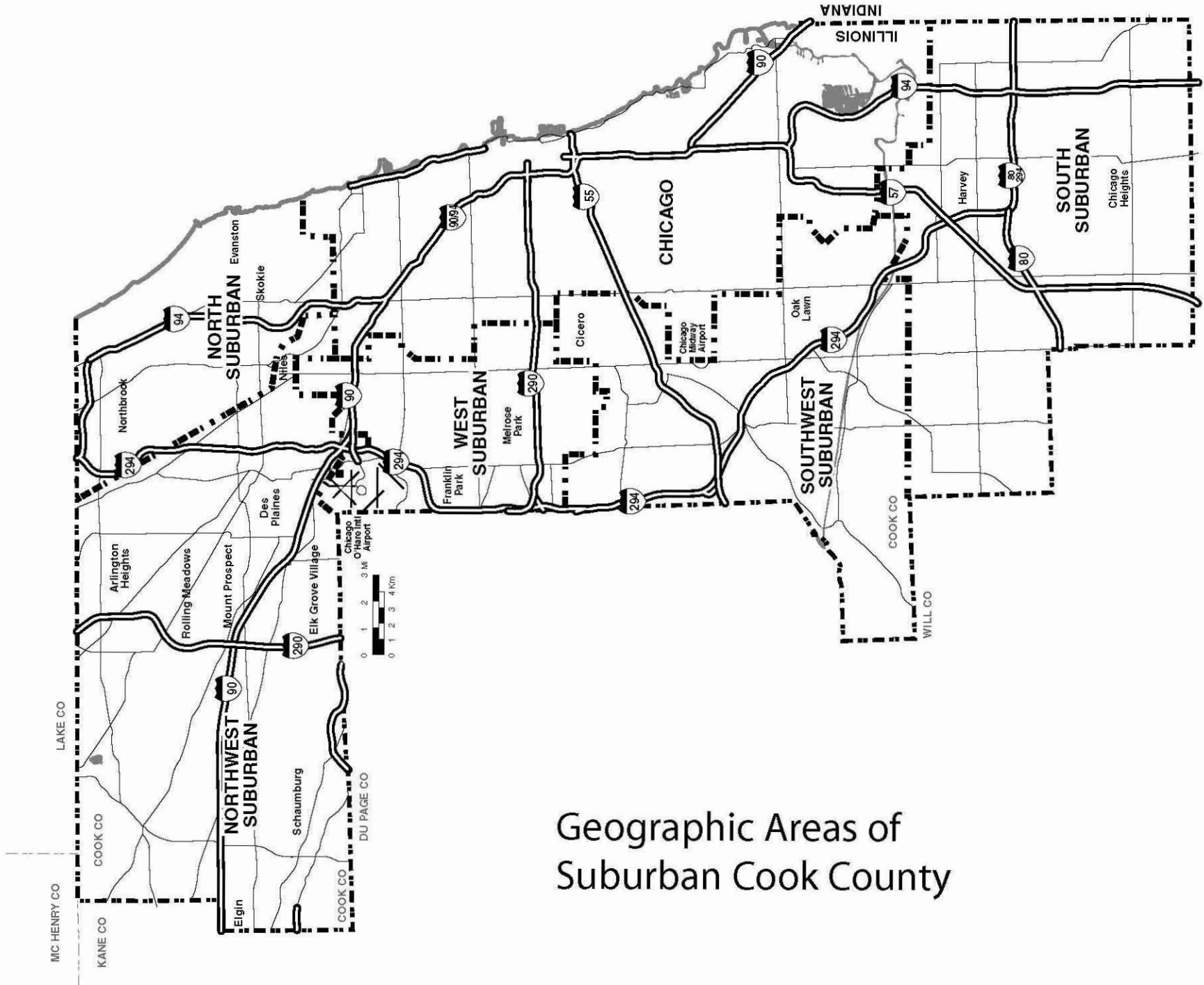

Where Workers Work Announcement

The *Where Workers Work* publication features employment totals that are broken out by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) categories. NAICS provides industry categories which better reflect the United States and Illinois economies.

Industries are organized on the basis of their production activities (supply) alone, as opposed to the mixture of supply and demand characteristics used to classify industries under the SIC. NAICS also standardizes the classification system of the 3 partners in the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA): the United States, Canada, and Mexico.

Data Table Notes

In the following tables A/ represents numbers omitted to avoid disclosure of individual data. The suppression of data for an industry is a two-step process.

Primary suppression is an automated process. Industry employment greater than zero within a geographic region is suppressed if:

- 1) Less than 3 establishments in an industry for a geographic region; or
- 2) One establishment accounts for at least 80% of the total employment in an industry within a geographic region.

Secondary suppression is a manual process. When only one industry within a geographic region has been suppressed through primary suppression, then it becomes necessary to suppress data for at least one other industry within that geographic region to protect against the disclosure of individual data.

The institution of multiple worksite coding precludes the comparison of data beginning with 1991 with data from earlier years.

City of Chicago includes O'Hare International Airport.
